A TRAVELLING EXHIBITION BY
YOUNG SKATEBOARDERS

SKATE is a travelling exhibition on skateboarding culture, produced by the Region Museum of Kristianstad in collaboration with young skaters.

The exhibition showcases works based on personal stories from young skaters at Bryggeriets Gymnasium, a high school located in Malmö, and local skate associations from all over Sweden. They have portrayed their everyday lives and experiences using cameras and skateboards. Sound, film, photographs and text portray moments from a subculture that is constantly on the move.

The exhibition will travel and visits public spaces in eight Swedish cities. From Umeå up north to Malmö down south, starting in May 2019.

The exhibition fits into two shipping containers and includes, digital screens, projectors, printed matter and skate objects.

With this exhibition the Region Museum of Kristianstad wants to highlight and explore a well-established yet controversial subculture which takes place in the city and breathes life to public spaces. The intention is to showcase the breadth of experiences and expressions in Swedish skateboarding culture today and to let more people take part in it.
